BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Develop and deploy a comprehensive policy to make available and maximize the expected use life, facilitate efficient repair, reuse, and recycling of manufactured products. Minimize the use and maximize recycling of strategic materials. Promote widespread reduction, usage, or composting of food waste.

- Verifiable estimates of the expected use life of products would influence consumer decisions, encouraging the manufacture of more durable goods, thus reducing the environmental effects of consumerism such as landfills, incinerators, and threats to public health.
